

### **Presidents Message**

For 26 years, Rebuilding Together Mountain Communities has done its part in bringing the generosity of this great community to those in need so that they can continue to live and enjoy the safety of their own homes. Without warning, last March Rebuilding Day was greatly impeded by the isolation requirements of the pandemic. Our biggest challenge was finding a way to keep our commitments to the five recipients we had chosen the previous fall for Rebuilding Day. No longer could we have large groups of volunteers gathering at the Twin Peaks Senior Center, nor could we send volunteers to family homes putting our recipients at risk. We developed a plan to hire paid Contractors and Tradesmen to complete the proj-



ects in much the same way as we operate our Emergency Repair Program throughout the year. This Special Emergency Program has been a historical success, helping more people than ever throughout the year with emergencies that can't wait until Rebuilding Day in April. Our Home Safety Modification Program, which also operates year-round, installs CO and smoke alarms, grab bars and safety rails in bathrooms, and makes numerous repairs of outside ramps and railings, all at no cost to the homeowner.





### **People Helping People**

#### What is Rebuilding Together?

Christmas in April Mountain Communities was formed in 1994 as an incorporated 501(c)(3) non-profit public benefit agency, whose purpose is to provide home repair and maintenance service to low-income elderly and/or disabled homeowners, free of charge. In 2005, Christmas in April adopted its new official name, Rebuilding Together, in response to a directive from the National Organization.

#### What are the Goals of Rebuilding Together?

Rebuilding Together is about getting involved and making a difference in our community. The goals of Rebuilding Together are three-fold: 1) To improve quality of life for our elderly and/or disabled citizens, 2) To create an avenue of service for our community members at large, and 3) To help restore and beautify each mountain community where we live and work.

#### Who Supports Rebuilding Together?

Rebuilding Together is supported entirely by individual contributions of money, time and materials. This includes local businesses, community service organizations, private individuals, corporations, churches and foundations. Through the combined efforts of many people from different walks of life, we form a team that comes together on a single day to help our neighbors in the American "barn-raising" tradition!

#### What is the National Scope?

The headquarters of Rebuilding Together is in Washington, DC. Over 150 affiliates refurbish thousands of homes across the country every April on Rebuilding Day. The market value of services rendered by Rebuilding Together volunteers on this day alone is in the hundreds of millions of dollars each year. Rebuilding Together Mountain Communities is the only affiliate in San Bernardino County.

#### How are Homeowner Recipients Selected?

The Rebuilding Together Home Selection Team selects the projects based on 10 criteria, which include income, length of home ownership, disability, age, complexity of project, etc. Recipients must be elderly and/or disabled homeowners who cannot work themselves or cannot maintain their homes due to disability or limited income.

#### Who Does All That Work?

Volunteers from each mountain community provide the teamwork necessary to complete an assortment of assigned tasks; licensed contractors provide most professional skills necessary to successfully complete each project.

### 2020 Rebuilding Review

### House #1 Crestline Sponsors: Mtn Sunrise Rotary, LA Rotary, DiCarlo Trust, Joan E Leopold

This homeowner is a 74 year old single woman living in Crestline who has been in her home for 17 years. Her disabilities are cardiomyopathy and osteoporosis. Repairs needed included roof repair due to a chimney leak and cleaning roof of debris, hauling off old fencing and installing new fencing around property, repair and rein-



force deck and deck railings, install 4 new security doors and install broken glass in back door window.

#### House #2 Lake Arrowhead Sponsors: CA Bank & Trust,

#### Crest Forest Senior Citizens Club, Running Springs Golden Oak Club



This homeowner is a 41 year old single woman who is a disabled veteran. She has been in her home for 6 years. Her repairs included removing a hornet nest and plugging woodpecker holes on the exterior of her home, repair to railings along her parking area, building a roof over the entry to prevent snow and rain from coming

down on entry, and replacing a tub shower valve with single handle anti-scald valve. We also installed a cell phone booster.

### House #3 Crestline Sponsors: Lake Arrowhead Presbyterian Church, O-Ongo Pali

This homeowner is an 83 year old single woman from Crestline who is a diabetic and has been in her home for 5 years. We repaired loose boards in her deck and cut clearance for tree protruding through her deck well as removed pine needles



from her roof. We also installed a foundation wall along the front of the house to include a buildup wall connecting the foundation to the front edge of the living room floor.

### House #4 Crestline Sponsors: Mountain Storage, Mountain West Financial

This homeowner is a 51 year old single woman from Crestline. She has been in her home for 9 years. She has multiple health issues and her daughter helps out a great deal. Her repairs included replacing a water heater, replacing a garbage disposal, repairing rusted galvanized pipe in the bedroom wall and repairing a leak in galvanized piping in her laundry room.

#### House #5 Twin Peaks Sponsors: Ted Roy Charity Foundation, Union Bank

This homeowner is a 76 year old single woman who has lived in her home in Twin Peaks for 45 years. She was a recipient 12 years ago and is not disabled. She worked for many years in the MCH kitchen. We re-




placed rotted eves, deck boards and handrails, and the asphalt in her driveway was repaired.


