For the 30th year, on the last Saturday in April, Rebuilding Together Mountain Communities accomplished its goals and has done its part in bringing the generosity of this close-knit community to those homeowners who need help with critical repairs to their homes, and restore their hope that they may continue to live in their homes and be "warm, safe and dry".

Rebuilding Day was a great success. We helped four deserving homeowners with repairs to their homes that were very much needed. I'm very thankful to all those who contributed with their time, energy,

talents, funds and selfless perseverance. As in many times past, it was such a joy to watch so many with such great attitudes working together, solving problems, and having such a great time. These are the attributes that make this community great and the whole world needs more of them. It was also very rewarding to see our recipients transition from being burdened to a look of hope (as if a weight had been lifted off them) and then to inspiration during the whole process.

This year our Emergency Repair program was swamped. We offer this year-round repair program to take care of vital repairs that can't wait for our annual Rebuilding Day at the end of April. Because of all the damage caused by "Snowmageddon," people were calling in from all over. There were the regular small jobs and the very large jobs, like roofs and collapsed decks. As a result, we ended up using up all our available funds (which was more than we usually have) to take care of as many as we could. We still have a backlog of people who need help that we plan on helping if more funds come in. Using only preferred licensed contractors, with this program we perform the majority of the repairs we do annually.

Our motto is "Warm, Safe & Dry." With that as our guide, over the years, we have touched the lives of hundreds of people in need and given so many selfless people a venue to express their love and generosity to so many who desperately need it. Our hope is, as we refurbish homes, that we positively change forever the lives of all involved.

I am so very grateful to all those who gave from the heart and made this year a success. I am looking forward to another great year. So, do yourself a favor, on the last Saturday in April, "Come out, pitch in, and bless a neighbor in need."

2024 Rebuilding Review

House 1 - Cedarpines Park

Karen is an 80 year old women living in Cedarpines Park who lost her husband two years ago. Karen is an Army veteran who served as a nurse. Karen's gutters were torn apart during "Snowmageddon" as well as damage done to the facia on the exterior of the home. We were able to replace the gutters with new ones as well as repair the damaged fascia boards. Volunteers also repaired her front stairs and some siding and raked and hauled off two dumpsters of yard waste.

House 2 - Running Springs

Alicia is a single woman living in Running Springs. She had firewood that needed to be split and stacked, and a fence and gate that needed repairing. Volunteers also did some touch-up painting to the exterior of the house and yard clean-up, hauling off two dumpsters of debris.

This home belongs to a family with four young children, living in Crestline. Their deck was damaged during "Snowmageddon" and was replaced on Rebuilding Day. The team built a new set of stairs, since the old ones were unsafe. There were also a number of plumbing and electrical repairs done, a new microwave installed, a window repaired as well as fascia boards. There was an extensive yard clean-up done that day and by the end of day the children had a safe yard to play in.

The volunteers also moved furnishings to the outside in preparation for new flooring that was installed on the Monday after Rebuilding Day. Her yard was raked and cleaned and when the day was over, her daughter had a place to have a trampoline, and a basketball set-up.

What is Rebuilding Together?

Christmas in April Mountain Communities was formed in 1994 as an incorporated 501(c)(3) non-profit public benefit agency, whose purpose is to provide home repair and maintenance service to low-income elderly and/or disabled homeowners, free of charge. In 2005, Christmas in April adopted its new official name, Rebuilding Together, in response to a directive from the National Organization.

What are the Goals of Rebuilding Together?

Rebuilding Together is about getting involved and making a difference in our community. The goals of Rebuilding Together are three-fold: 1) To improve quality of life for our elderly and/or disabled citizens, 2) To create an avenue of service for our community members at large, and 3) To help restore and beautify each mountain community where we live and work.





Who Supports Rebuilding Together?

Rebuilding Together is supported entirely by individual contributions of money, time and materials. This includes local businesses, community service organizations, private individuals, corporations, churches and foundations. Through the combined efforts of many people from different walks of life, we form a team that comes together on a single day to help our neighbors in the American "barn-raising" tradition!

What is the National Scope?

The headquarters of Rebuilding Together is in Washington, DC. Over 150 affiliates refurbish thousands of homes across the country every April on Rebuilding Day. The market value of services rendered by Rebuilding Together volunteers on this day alone is in the hundreds of millions of dollars each year. Rebuilding Together Mountain Communities is the only affiliate in San Bernardino County.




How are Homeowner Recipients Selected?

The Rebuilding Together Home Selection Team selects the projects based on 10 criteria, which include income, length of home ownership, disability, age, complexity of project, etc. Recipients must be elderly and/or disabled homeowners who cannot work themselves or cannot maintain their homes due to disability or limited income.

Who Does All That Work?

Volunteers from each mountain community provide the teamwork necessary to complete an assortment of assigned tasks; licensed contractors provide most professional skills necessary to successfully complete each project.
